STANDARD 1

The student understands the Bible as God's story of the redemption of mankind.

To meet this standard, the student will:

Benchmark 2.1.1: Understand how the Bible fits together as a book and has different types of writings.

Indicators:

<u>Benchmark 2.1.2</u>: Understand the remarkable love and works of God on behalf of mankind and mankind's various responses.

Indicators:

- 2.1.2.1 Recognize that Jesus showed that He was the Lord by healing those who were sick
- 2.1.2.2 Describe that the Holy Spirit gave the apostles power to do miracles and to speak boldly about Jesus
- 2.1.2.3 Describe that the parable of the unforgiving servant helped the disciples understand God's forgiveness
- 2.1.2.4 Become familiar with some of Jesus' miracles
- 2.1.2.5 Recognize that God did not leave the world without hope; instead, He provided a plan of salvation

Benchmark 2.1.3: Understand that God has a purpose for his people which continues throughout history.

- 2.1.3.1 Describe Peter's role in God's story

- 2.1.4.4 Describe that God does not rejoice in punishing the wicked
- 2.1.4.5 Describe that Jesus kept His promise to send the Holy Spirit
- 2.1.4.6 Describe the birth of John the Baptist as one of God's fulfilled promises

Benchmark 2.1.5: Understand how God worked through the nation of Israel to bless all of mankind.

Indicators:

- 2.1.5.1 Describe that the parable of the tenants teaches that because God's chosen people rejected Jesus, God offered the good news to the Gentiles
- 2.1.5.2 Become familiar with the events that took place among the return of God's people
- 2.1.5.3 Recognize why and how God divided His kingdom
- 2.1.5.4 Become familiar with Kings and Prophets of Israel
- 2.1.5.5 Recognize events that lead to the fall of Israel
- 2.1.5.6 Describe that the Exodus was part of God's plan for His people
- 2.1.5.7 Describe how God brought His people into the Promised Land
- 2.1.5.8 Recognize Israel's pattern of obedience and disobedience during the period of the judges
- 2.1.5.9 Describe that God's kingdom was united until Israel's consistent disobedience forced God to split the kingdom

Benchmark 2.1.6: Understand the redemptive work of Jesus Christ.

Indicators:

- 2.1.6.1 Recognize that Jesus gave Himself willingly to His enemies
- 2.1.6.2 Describe that Jesus died for the sins of the world
- 2.1.6.3 Describe that Jesus suffered on the cross for our sins
- 2.1.6.4 Describe that Jesus died willingly so that we might live
- 2.1.6.5 Recognize that Jesus conquered death and arose from the grave
- 2.1.6.6 Describe that Jesus ascended into heaven
- 2.1.6.7 Recognize that God showed His love for us by sending Jesus to die for our salvation

Benchmark 2.1.7: Understand Christ's establishment of the Church and its growth.

- 2.1.7.1 Describe that Jesus cleared out the temple to reestablish it as a house of prayer
- 2.1.7.2 Become familiar with Jesus' first teachings in the temple
- 2.1.7.3 Describe that the parable of the mustard seed and yeast point to the small beginning of the Kingdom of God
- 2.1.7.4 Describe that the parables of the hidden treasure and the pearl teach that the Kingdom of God is of great value

Benchmark 2.1.8: Understand the biblical use of prophesy and symbolism.

- 2.1.8.1 Recognize that Isaiah prophesied about a coming messiah
- 2.1.8.2 Describe John and his revelation's role in God's story
- 2.1.8.3 Recognize what the new creation described in the book of Revelation will look like
- 2.1.8.4 Describe that the parable of wheat and weeds points to the final judgment of Jesus' heavenly kingdom

Bible GRADE 2

STANDARD 2

The student understands the Biblical concepts involved with making an informed commitment to Christ.

To meet this standard, the student will:

Benchmark 2.2.1: Understand that we are created in God's image for the purpose of being in relationship with Him.

Indicators:

- 2.2.1.1 Describe that Jesus' love included the Gentiles
- 2.2.1.2 Describe that God created the world and sin destroyed this world
- 2.2.1.3 Describe that God destroyed the sinful world, but saved Noah and his family

Benchmark 2.2.2: Understand that Sin has separated us from God and made relationship with Him impossible.

Indicator:

2.2.2.1 Describe that the parable of the workers in the vineyard teaches that Kingdom standards and earthly standards are very different

Benchmark 2.2.3: Understand that God created us with the capacity to choose and our choices have consequences.

Indicators:

- 2.2.3.1 Describe that our response to the gospel is to be like that of a seed that falls on fertile soil
- 2.2.3.2 Describe that James 1 teaches us that God wants us to control our tempers and to listen to others
- 2.2.3.3 Describe that the parable of the sower tells of the many different responses to the gospel
- 2.2.3.4 Recognize that the captivity of Judah was due to their disobedience

Benchmark 2.2.4: Understand Jesus as God incarnate.

Indicators:

- 2.2.4.1 Recognize that even though Jesus was without sin, He was baptized to identify with sinners
- 2.2.4.2 Describe that Jesus was born in Bethlehem, thereby fulfilling God's promise to send a Savior
- 2.2.4.3 Describe that Jesus came to earth to bring us salvation
- 2.2.4.4 Describe that Jesus' triumphal entry fulfilled the Old Testament prophesy
- 2.2.4.5 Recognize how the Last Supper became a replacement for celebrating Passover and it showed Jesus as a servant and a comforter
- 2.2.4.6 Recognize that Jesus was betrayed and arrested
- 2.2.4.7 Become familiar with the events of Jesus' trial
- 2.2.4.8 Describe that Jesus is the Lord of the Sabbath
- 2.2.4.9 Describe that Jesus is the Ruler of evil spirits
- 2.2.4.10 Describe that Jesus is the rejected one
- 2.2.4.11 Describe that Jesus is a miracle worker
- 2.2.4.12 Describe that Jesus is a friend of children
- 2.2.4.13 Recognize how Peter's confession points to who Jesus is
- 2.2.4.14 Recognize the events surrounding Jesus' temptation
- 2.2.4.15 Describe the circumstances surrounding Jesus' birth

Benchmark 2.2.5: Understand that Jesus' death and resurrection allows for a restored relationship with God.

Indicators:

- 2.2.5.1 Describe that Jesus died willingly on the cross for the sins of the world
- 2.2.5.2 Describe that Jesus conquered death and arose from the grave
- 2.2.5.3 Recognize that Jesus appeared to two people on the road to Emmaus and to his disciples
- 2.2.5.4 Describe that Jesus ascended to heaven

Benchmark 2.2.6: Understand that as God reveals Himself, we need to make a personal response of confession and belief in order to have a restored relationship with Him.

- 2.2.6.1 Describe that God's gracious generosity comes to all who accept Him as Lord
- 2.2.6.2 Describe that God requires us to repent of our sins
- 2.2.6.3 Describe that we must respond faithfully when we hear God's word
- 2.2.6.4 Describe that Jesus sent his disciples to the Jewish people to tell them to repent



STANDARD 3

The student learns how to live out *Christian love, obedience and service in ways appropriate* for their spiritual maturity.

This is a standard that we expect our students to be developing in throughout their studies. Students may at times be evaluated on their growth and development of these standards but will not be expected to meet all of them to pass a class or to graduate. Also many of these standards correspond with the Guidance Counseling curriculum (G.C.). The following are the expectations and goals that we have for our students. To meet this standard, the student will:

- 2.3.2.6 Identify the importance of virtue and choose to do what is right regardless of the circumstances

Benchmark 2.3.3: Identify the need for followers of Christ to respect others and honor God

Indicators:

2.3.3.1 Identify the need to respect themselves by practicing good personal hygiene, dressing neatly and being proud of being a unique creation of God.

Indicators:

- 2.3.4.1 Identify the importance of being polite and choose to greet people
- 2.3.4.2 Identify that all people are important and valuable
- 2.3.4.3 Choose to accept all people for who they are (no judging based on any physical characteristic)
- 2.3.4.4 Identify the importance of making all visitors feel welcome at our school

Benchmark 2.3.5: Identify the need for followers of Christ to see success in light of God's plan for their life and eternity

- 2.3.6.4 Solve problems related to working with others, such as choosing to listen to others, explaining their ideas, and being positive and encouraging.
