### STANDARD 1

The student will develop and communicate ideas by creating works of art and gain respect for their own work and the work of others

### To meet this standard, the student will:

<u>Benchmark AHS.1.1</u>: Understand that art is a personal expression, has value, teaches about other times and places, and connects in important ways to other areas of learning.

## **Indicators:**
