### STANDARD 1

The student will develop and communicate ideas by creating works of art and gain respect for their own work and the work of others

To meet this standard, the student will:

<u>Benchmark 1.1.1</u>: Understand that art is a personal expression, has value, teaches about other times and places, and connects in important ways to other areas of learning.

#### **Indicators**

- 1.1.1.1 Recognize and discuss various solutions to a single art problem.
- 1.1.1.2 Use the senses of sight, touch, and hearing as inspirations for works of art.

  - primary colors—red, blue, and yellow

### STANDARD 3

The student will examine works of art and make informed judgments about them based on established visual arts criteria.

- <u>Benchmark 1.3.1</u>: Use a variety of strategies to analyze the visual qualities and interpret the meanings of works of art as well as employ critical evaluation skills in the production of their own works of art. Indicators:
  - 1.3.1.1 Discuss why viewers may have different responses to works of art.
  - 1.3.1.2 View works of art and describe similarities and differences between them.
  - 1.3.1.3 Describe and discuss the visual qualities and content of works of art, using an art vocabulary.

### **STANDARD 4**

The student will reflect on and analyze personal responses to the expressive and communicative qualities of works of art and will understand that background, knowledge, and experiences influence the perceptions of works of art.

To meet this standard, the student will:

<u>Benchmark 1.4.1</u>: Draw conclusions and reflect on the nature, meaning, and value of art, based on their dual roles as both creator and viewer of art.

### **Indicators:**

- 1.4.1.1 Discuss the reasons why works of art have value.
- 1.4.1.2 Express a point of view regarding what art is and what purpose art serves.
- 1.4.1.3 Describe and discuss ideas and emotions communicated in works of art.
