STANDARD 1

The student will develop and communicate ideas by creating works of art and gain respect for their own work and the work of others

To meet this standard, the student will:

Benchmark 3.1.1: Understand that art is a personal expression, has value, teaches about other times and places, and connects in important ways to other areas of learning.

Indicators

- 3.1.1.1 Identify innovative solutions used by artists to solve visual problems.
- 3.1.1.2 Use various art processes and techniques to produce works of art that demonstrate craftsmanship.

STANDARD 2

Indicators:

- 3.2.1.1 Identify and discuss common characteristics in various art careers (e.g., painter, sculptor, illustrator, visual art teacher).
- 3.2.1.2 Discuss how history, culture, and the visual arts influence each other.
- 3.2.1.3 Identify distinguishing characteristics of landscape, seascape, and cityscape.
- 3.2.1.4 Compare and contrast architectural styles of ancient cultures, including Greece and Rome.

STANDARD 3

The student will examine works of art and make informed judgments about them based on established visual arts criteria.

- 3.3.1.3 Discuss the difference between art and other types of objects, using appropriate art vocabulary.
- 3.3.1.4 Analyze works of art by subject matter, including portrait, landscape, still life, and narrative.

 - rhythm
 - balance—symmetry and asymmetry

GRADE 3

STANDARD 4

The student will reflect on and analyze personal responses to the expressive and communicative qualities of works of art and will understand that background, knowledge, and experiences influence the perceptions of works of art.

To meet this standard, the student will:

<u>Benchmark 3.4.1</u>: Draw conclusions and reflect on the nature, meaning, and value of art, based on their dual roles as both creator and viewer of art.

Indicators:

- 3.4.1.1 Examine the relationship between form and function in the artifacts of a culture.
- 3.4.1.2 Identify common attributes in works of art produced by artists within one culture.
- 3.4.1.3 Determine why art has value.
- 3.4.1.4 Develop and describe personal reasons for valuing works of art.
